# Faith Chat:

Pentecost, the festival 50 days after Easter, is a celebration that carries with it many meanings and possible responses. It's the birthday for the Church, it's a reversal of the tower of Babel, it's an anointing of apostles, it's the fulfillment of Jesus' promise of the coming of the Holy Spirit, it's the building of a community. And that's just for starters! Pentecost is also a time, as Peter proclaims loosely quoting the prophet Joel, of visions, dreams, portents and prophesying. Prophesying is a tricky word in our culture as it's come to mean forecasting the future. But in biblical terms, prophesying is about telling the truth of what is happening in our communities and what the outcomes could be if changes aren't made. Prophesying is revealing where God is at work and is inviting us to join God in ushering in the kingdom.

Prophesying is continuous work, it never ends! In February, St. Matthew Lutheran Church council met for a strategic planning morning. We prayed, meditated on scripture and did the hard work of naming our gifts, our opportunities, aspirations and where we think God is calling us to join in the kingdom building work. We produced a 1-3-5 year plan that we think is a good conversation to continue with the congregation as a whole. To this end, on May 19, Pentecost we will begin to seek input from you on how we can best follow Jesus out to the ends of the earth with the message of God's love for all. Look for poster boards with information and postit notes for your input. You do not need to put your name on the input, however, it would be great to know who is thinking what to deepen our plan.

We are grateful for the ministry that God has put in front of us-we are confident that whatever God calls us to do, God will gift us with the resources to accomplish. Thank you for your faithful commitment to being the body of Christ with us at St. Matthew!

It's snowing, I'm sick or I just can't get moving on a Sunday morning. Don't worry you can still watch service.


